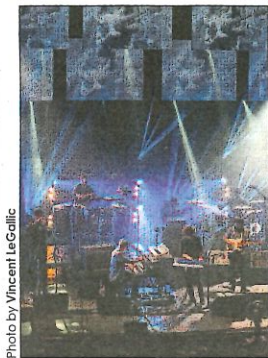
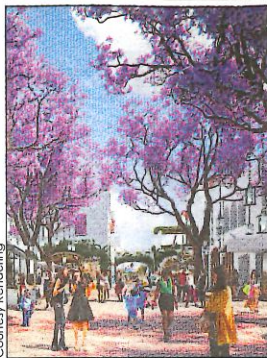

The Barbara Ireland Walk and Run offers three course options: a 5K, 10K, and 15K, all along Santa Barbara's beautiful waterfront. The goal is to raise \$50,000 for breast cancer research and programs in Santa Barbara!

All of the funds raised from event registration fees and pledges will benefit local breast cancer research and programs at the Ridley-Tree Cancer Center at Samsom Clinic. These programs include clinical research, which provides access to cutting-edge therapies here in our own community; genetic counseling, which provides patients with the chance to determine their genetic risk for
