

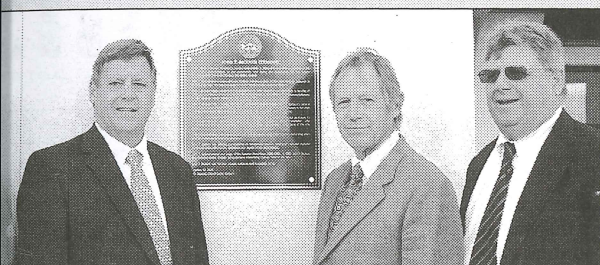

Dennis was born the great-great-grandson of Jose De la Guerra y Noriega, the first commandant of the Royal Presidio of Santa Barbara. His grandfather, James B. Rickard, was a US postmaster and his grandmother was Acacia Oreña Rickard, granddaughter of Jose De la Guerra y Noriega and Maria Antonio Carrillo.

A funeral mass and memorial service were held at the Old Mission Santa Barbara on January 9th, 2016. Fr. Larry Gosselin, OFM presided at the service. Speakers included his brother Tom Rickard, Erin Graffy de Garcia, Cas Stimson, and Father Gosselin. The mission was full to capacity for the service and a salute was fired by Presidio reenactment soldiers in his honor. Dennis was buried in the family crypt at the Old Mission Cemetery. A reception followed the service at the Santa Barbara Club.

Dennis was preceded in death by his mother, Marion Foster and father, John T. Rickard, and cousin Charles Rickard King, of Los Alamos. He is survived by four brothers,
